

RESOLUTION NO. 20260127-05

Resolution Declaring Certain Outdated and Nonfunctional Equipment of the Lawrence County Solid Waste Department as Surplus Property and Authorizing Its Sale or Disposal

Whereas, the Lawrence County Solid Waste Department has identified certain equipment, containers, machinery, or related items that are outdated, nonfunctional, or beyond reasonable repair due to age, obsolescence, excessive wear, or the unavailability of replacement parts; and

Whereas, such property no longer serves a present useful operational purpose for the County, occupies storage space, and may continue to generate unnecessary maintenance, storage, or insurance costs; and

Whereas, the Lawrence County Legislative Body finds that it is in the best interest of the County to formally declare such items as surplus property to permit their lawful sale, trade, recycling, or disposal in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated § 5-14-108 and other applicable laws, policies, and procedures governing surplus county property; and

Whereas, any sale, scrap, or salvage value realized from such surplus property should be returned to the appropriate Solid Waste Department fund and properly accounted for in accordance with County financial policies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lawrence County Legislative Body meeting in Regular Session on this 17th day of February 2026 (as postponed from 27th day of January 2026) that:

Section 1. Declaration of Surplus. The items of personal property, specifically an old recycling hopper and conveyor belt, submitted by the Solid Waste Department and approved by the Budget Committee, are hereby declared surplus property of Lawrence County, Tennessee.

Section 2. Authorization to Dispose. The Solid Waste Director is hereby authorized to donate the surplus equipment described in Section 1 to Wayne County Solid Waste, subject to the following express conditions, which the Solid Waste Director shall have acknowledged and accepted by the recipient in writing:

- a. The donated property shall be used solely for governmental solid waste or recycling purposes.
- b. The property shall not be sold, transferred, assigned, or otherwise conveyed by Wayne County.
- c. If the property is no longer needed, ceases to be used, or is otherwise taken out of service by Wayne County for any reason, the property shall be returned to Lawrence County, at no cost to Lawrence County.

Section 3. No Monetary Consideration. This donation is made without monetary consideration and no proceeds shall be received by Lawrence County.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.
