Adopting a Continuing Budget for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2026, and Authorizing the Expenditure of Funds Pending Adoption of the Annual Budget

Whereas, the Lawrence County Board of County Commissioners has not yet completed its consideration and adoption of the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026; and

Whereas, it is necessary to provide for the continued operation of the various offices, departments, institutions, and agencies of Lawrence County pending the adoption of the annual budget and property tax rate for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026; and

Whereas, the Lawrence County Board of County Commissioners finds it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Lawrence County that County government continue to operate without interruption while the budget process is completed;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Lawrence County Board of County Commissioners meeting in Special Session on June 30, 2026, that the appropriations authorized for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, are hereby continued on an interim basis, and the various offices, departments, institutions, and agencies of Lawrence County are authorized to expend funds at the same level as authorized during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.

Be It Further Resolved, that the property tax rate in effect for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, shall remain in effect on an interim basis until such time as a property tax rate for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, is adopted according to law.

Be It Further Resolved, that no local funds shall be expended or obligated in excess of the appropriations authorized for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, until a new budget is adopted; provided, however, that expenditures mandated by state law or by rules and regulations duly adopted by the State of Tennessee are hereby authorized and incorporated into this continuing budget.

Be It Further Resolved, that the County Executive and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money through revenue anticipation notes, not exceeding sixty percent (60%) of the appropriations of each individual fund under this continuing budget, to pay expenses herein authorized until taxes and other revenues for the fiscal year 2026-2027 have been collected. Any such notes shall first be approved by the State Director of Local Finance and shall be issued pursuant to the applicable provisions of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. All such notes shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2027.

Be It Further Resolved, that this continuing budget shall remain in effect from July 1, 2026, until such time as the annual budget and property tax rate for the fiscal year 2026-2027 have been finally adopted and approved according to law.

Be It Further Resolved, that this Resolution shall take effect upon its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

Whereas, the proposed Option to Purchase and the related City of Lawrenceburg resolution are attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference;

SECTION 1. Approval of Option to Purchase. This Option to Purchase entered into as of the date the last of the Sellers or Buyer signs, as shown on the signature block set forth below (the "Effective Date"), by and between **LAWRENCE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee, and THE CITY OF LAWRENCEBURG, TENNESSEE, a municipal corporation**, hereinafter called the "Sellers," and the **STATE OF TENNESSEE**, hereinafter called the "Buyer":

WITNESSETH: In consideration of the sum of \$1.00 as earnest money and the mutual promises herein stated, the Sellers hereby grants to the Buyer an exclusive option (the "Option") to purchase certain property in **Lawrence County**, which property is commonly known as **169 Southern Tennessee Lane, Lawrenceburg, TN 38464, Tax Map 096, Parcel 036.02 SI 000 and Tax Map 096, Parcel 036.02 SI 001** (the "Property").

This Option shall be exercised by notice from the Buyer to the Sellers (the "Option Notice") within 180 days from the Effective Date. If this Option is so exercised, the closing of the purchase (the "Closing") shall take place not more than 30 days after the date Sellers receive the Option Notice unless extended by agreement of the parties. This Option is subject to the following terms of the sale to be satisfied prior to or by the Closing:

1. Buyer will furnish and pay for title insurance or attorney's certificate of title as desired.
2. Closing costs shall be allocated as follows: a) Buyer shall pay the recording costs, title exam and any title insurance premiums, and one-half (1/2) the closing or escrow fees charged by the title company chosen by Buyer; b) Sellers shall pay deed preparation fees, one-half (1/2) the closing or escrow fees charged by the title company chosen by Buyer, Sellers' own title company or attorney's fees, if any, and all property taxes due and payable on the property. Any other costs associated with the property shall be prorated as of the date of Closing and paid by Sellers. Rollback Taxes, if any, will be paid by Sellers.
3. Exclusive possession of the Property shall be given to the Buyer at the Closing.
4. The Buyer will verify the legal description of the Property by survey or otherwise, to its satisfaction and at Buyer's expense. If the description of the Property as shown on said survey differs from the description of the Property as described on the deed vesting title in the Property to Sellers, Sellers shall convey the Property to Buyer utilizing the description on said survey.
5. Possession to be given at the time of closing unless Buyer agrees to a later date. Sellers shall convey the Property by a good and valid warranty deed, subject only to encumbrances acceptable to Buyer in its sole and absolute discretion.
6. The purchase price for the Property shall be **\$9,000,000.00**. Payment shall be made in cash or immediately available funds at the Closing.
7. All property shall be deeded to the "STATE OF TENNESSEE" unless otherwise required by statute.
8. Buyer shall have the right, at its sole expense, to conduct any inspections of the Property it deems necessary or desirable prior to the Closing. Buyer shall provide copies of any inspection reports it obtains to Sellers upon request.
9. The Sellers will provide the Buyer with copies of any and all leases, liens, or other encumbrances of any type, recorded or unrecorded, in its possession or control affecting the Property.
10. The Sellers will provide adequate proof, to the satisfaction of the State, to establish his or her ownership in the Property.


